Whereas, our citizens enjoy the most affordable food in the world, spending, on average, about ten percent of their disposable income on food annually.

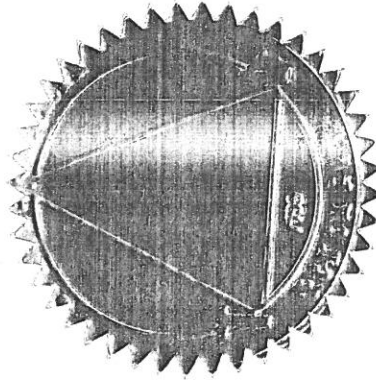
