Council Member Gaunce opened the meeting with a prayer.

Council Member Bunnell asked what criteria was used to determine the streets needed to be paved? Superintendent Simmons said the Assistant Superintendent Lincoln Bell and me have driven each one of these streets and the criteria used was potholes, cracks, flaking and unevenness. Council Member Trigg asked where would these stack up on the old list? Mayor Armstrong said the old list had probably ran out. That Roger and Lincoln could take this list and start a new list. ORDINANCE - 1ST READING – ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE CITY OF GLASGOW ANNUAL BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 7-1-2019 THROUGH 6-30-2020 ESTABLISHING REVENUES AND RESOURCES AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF CITY GOVERNMENT Sponsored by Finance Committee

A proposed ordinance was presented for the first time and caused to be read for the first time.

MOTION was made by Council Member Kirkpatrick for the first reading approval of the Ordinance

Council Member Bunnell asked City Treasurer Stephanie Garrett. Where do you see current trends and revenue sources going at this current budget and where do you see it in the past? Treasurer Garrett said our revenue has dropped and probably be somewhere around \$200,000 short this year, we have a couple of businesses coming in we have budgeted \$120,000 less this year in that one category. There have been a few little ticks up here and there in some of the others, other than that, it has been flat. Bunnell asked and again, that is on the Occupational Tax? She agreed on the Occupational and Withholding. With this new budget, what concerns are there? What major concern is going to keep us up at night? At some point revenue will to have to go up. You can't continue twisting this way for years now, you can't continue to, you can't grow with the same revenue, that cannot go up.

You are not going to be able to spend. Your expenses are going up and your revenues aren't. Bunnell said and the last question, in this budget, what areas are we highlighting for our city departments, city areas, which ones are highlighted this year compared to prior years? Garrett said the Rec Department has got \$500,000 for the Parks in it, Plaza has got \$342,500 in it for lighting, a few new Police vehicles in there again. Mayor Armstrong asked for any other questions or comments? Council Member Trigg asked on the Grants and Subsidies page, I.D.E.A. (Industrial Economic Authority) award, are we going to continue to give the regular amount of \$55,000 considering the last meeting of the Inter-Local Agreement, what is going to be the status? Mayor Armstrong said there is \$120,000 in there that you guys can vote on projects or for salaries up to \$60,000 and another \$60,000 that is available for projects, but you must vote it that way. It's in the budget. Council Member Gaunce said the last time we were here we talked about waiting until the Ad hoc committee reported to the rest of the I.D.E.A. board or the B.C.E.A. (Barren County Economic Authority) now. If I read right a couple weeks ago Fiscal Court agreed to do that. Now there is sentiment out there, wondering what we are going to do as a City, but my question is, it's my understanding and most agreements that if they just lapse without any change to it, that same agreement will continue until there is a change to it. So, I kind of took to our last meeting that we are going to come back at some point. We probably need to do something; I assume this will keep going to the same Board members and the same people until we redirect. If it was to fail or go under, then my question would be what are we going to do for Economic Development? And the third at this point would be are we going to take the recommendations from the committee that was hired to do that. Mayor Armstrong said you said the Fiscal Court had done likewise, what did you mean likewise? Gaunce said they took the recommendations, I think it's just the 1st reading on that, they took the recommendations all 5 recommendations of the Ad hoc committee, I wasn't on that group, but there was a group tasked with what we wanted to do with I.D.E.A. Board, it was voted unanimous through Fiscal Court to accept all 5 of those recommendations. Then I was surprised it wasn't on here, it lapses June 30, so we only have 1 more meeting, so if 1 of those things takes 2 meetings then we are already going to be, I am just looking for direction for the citizens. Mayor Armstrong said Fiscal Court voted to put 3 members of Fiscal Court in the place of Public officials and you all voted you did not want an elected official to be a voting member, so their Inter-Local Agreement is not going to work for us. My understanding is that if they propose that as an Inter-Local agreement then we can't go along with that because we are not going to put three (3) City Councilman on there and do away with people who know what they are doing. We are going to have to come up with what suits us and go back to them. Council Member Gaunce stated he took offense to that because you can't tell me that nobody among us 12 that could do a halfway job. But your point is I thought the City and County were working on this together. Mayor Armstrong said we were until you all voted it down. Council Member Gaunce said that Fiscal Court voted unanimously to accept the five (5) recommendations that the Ad hoc committee had and to put three (3) Fiscal Court members. I think that one of the recommendations was that one (1) person from City Council, one (1) person from Fiscal Court and two (2) appointees. I think the issue we had was that we didn't feel, I didn't feel, that the Mayor and Judge should be a voting member because I think that's too close. I'm not saying I'm right I'm just saying that's my opinion. If we are going to just let it lapse, what is our plan for Economic Development, or do we even have a plan? I'm just looking for direction for the citizens that are asking me, since the county voted unanimously, where we are at? And I did think we voted it down, but I think it's changed. I think the five (5) recommendations changed. That is what some of us were waiting on. Mayor Armstrong said we had a proposal from one of the council members that said that we would go with two (2) and one (1) council member which if you all want to vote it that way, then we can go back to Fiscal Court and say if you want to do the same thing instead of three (3) then we are

ready to work out something and if they say no then we will have to work out something. Council Member Gaunce said if you will give me the liberty, I will just read it. It says the number one (1) suggested item, are you all aware of that? The first one (1) was just one (1) from Fiscal Court, one (1) from City Council and one (1) from Cave City City Council. Mayor Armstrong said we are reading our Budget; we need to introduce this. What you guys want to do in a form of an ordinance and then get it passed through the whole Council. If that is what you all want to do. Council Member Gaunce said I thought he asked about where the money, which it does pertain the \$55,000, that is my question. What are we going to do? Mayor Armstrong said we are going to give \$55,000 it is in the budget. Council Member Gaunce said help me understand who is going to be on that after June 30? Who is going to be on that? Mayor Armstrong said it depends on what Fiscal Court does. If they do what they propose to do, it will be three (3) Fiscal Court members and for the City Gary Hartell. Scott Young did not want to be re-appointed, then Owen Lambert. Council Member Bunnell said Mayor Armstrong can we do the question on the budget vote and come back to this.

VOTE unanimous approval of the Council present

We have the first reading of our 2019-2020 Budget accepted. The 2nd reading will be at our next regularly scheduled meeting.

Mayor Armstrong said you that are interested in Industrial Development, why don't you all have a workshop sometime between now and our next meeting to see if you all can come up with what you feel like you would like to do and then we would try to propose that to the whole council and see how it works. Council Member Gaunce said I thought the first step of that was that they wanted three (3) from each group to prepare the Inter-Local agreement? Mayor Armstrong said that is what they are asking us to do, but we don't have to do what they want us to do. It is up to you guys right here. Council Member Bunnell said could we amend this agenda at the end of the meeting and discuss the Inter-Local agreement so that we could have a good discussion with what we laid out so far and just add that in. Thank you.

City Attorney Basil said he wanted to explain what nunc pro tunc is because he was asked by a member of the public what it meant. Occasionally an appointment will lapse, and the person or administration does not realize it. And when we make the re- appointment it is made nunc pro tunc which means retroactive back to the time of the expiration of the previous term. The reason that is important is if in that period of time an action was taken, that somebody finds fault with then that person on the board might not have had the authority to do that act and by going nunc pro tunc it validates the appointment back to the time when it should have been done. So that is what nunc pro tunc means, it basically means retroactive or back to the beginning of the term.

Motion passes

Council Member Honeycutt said if we decide to proceed to do this tonight, we don’t have to do the same thing Fiscal Court does if we agree with what they do, and they agree with what we do. If they approve the method of selecting and we approve their method, then that’s okay. Council Member Bunnell said I would like to suggest is we appoint three (3) members from this Legislative body to meet with the three (3) members of the Legislative body of the Fiscal Court and let’s work on the Inter-Local agreement and bring it back to the various Legislative bodies to approve or deny that action. Council Member Gaunce said I would like to see us mirror what they did. We don’t have to take the advice from the committee but the recommendations that I read were solid economic recommendations. Council Member Bunnell said he would like to get a three (3) member committee together and he would like to serve on it with Council Member Norman and Council Member Trigg. To move forward with this and meet with them and get a proposal to you so we can move forward with this.

Barren County Judge Executive Micheal Hale came to the podium. He wanted to clarify that the recommendations that were put forth by the search committee were adopted by the Fiscal Court. There were two (2) of us who voted against the agreement with the Bowling Green Chamber of Commerce. That was me and Magistrate Houchens because we didn’t agree with sending tax money to another

county. As far as the directors of the BCEA three (3) Fiscal Court members are the Directors. We are not doing a Ad Hoc committee. If there is a Ad Hoc committee you all create that will be the three (3) that will sit on it. The three (3) people from our economic committee, they meet all the criteria. Two (2) of them run a business, they must meet payroll, they are all three engaged with agriculture, one works directly with industry and they all three have extensive knowledge in financing and marketing. The court voted unanimously on it. That is where the Fiscal Court stands. Magistrate Dickerson will be the contact on that. Council Member Bunnell said our understanding is the Fiscal Court agreed to approve three (3) magistrates to be representatives to the Industrial Authority. Judge Hale said that is correct. Council Member Bunnell said according to the current Inter-Local agreement no legislative member can serve on the Industrial Authority Board. Judge Hale said yes there is also a statute that says you can change that so they can serve on the Industrial Authority Board. Judge Hale said no one has. Council Member Bunnell said how can we move forward when we haven't approved the agreement and the current agreement says legislative members cannot serve on the authority. Judge Hale said there are members that will serve until June 30 and the three (3) were tasked to start on the Inter-Local agreement immediately so they could take the reins July 1 or shortly thereafter. They will be the new directors. There is a statute that says you can change it for elected folks to serve. The agreement you all voted down was worked on by me (Judge Hale, Barren County Judge Executive), Mayor Armstrong (Mayor of Glasgow), Dwayne Hatcher (Mayor of Cave City) and Larry Poteet (Mayor of Park City). When you talk about accountability and oversight, I can't think of any better to serve on it. Council Member Bunnell said I don't see how they can serve when the existing Inter-Local agreement doesn't allow for legislative members to serve. Mayor Armstrong said any change must go to Frankfort to be approved. It takes a month to get it approved. We don't have to mirror what the County did. But we do need to get an Economic group together so we can get this. City Attorney Basil said it was my impression that the Inter-Local agreement that had been in existence has expired and we were working to make a new one and it was voted down. What the Judge is telling you is if there is a new Inter-Local agreement made it's going to say that Fiscal Court members are going to have three (3) positions on the I.D.E.A. Board because that decision has already been made it is not our decision to make. Mayor Armstrong said his suggestion is two individuals and one from the council. But we do need to get an Economic group together so we can move forward. Judge Hale said there would be one agreement for the whole county.
