1852 Hall Place Bed & Breakfast, 313 South Green Street, is located near historic downtown Glasgow. Take a step back in time. This pre-civil war home was visited by Abraham Lincoln, who studied under Judge Christopher Tompkins, a Underground Railroad supporter. Judge Tompkins built the home for Theodosia Tompkins Hall and Dr. James Hall. The home was built by slaves who handcrafted each brick on site creating 16 inch walls, 6 fireplaces and high ceilings. The Underground Railroad used a cave under the library room to move out of Glasgow to freedom. When Judge Tompkins died, his will provided lifetime care for each of his former slaves. Hall Place is on the National Registry of Historic Places.
